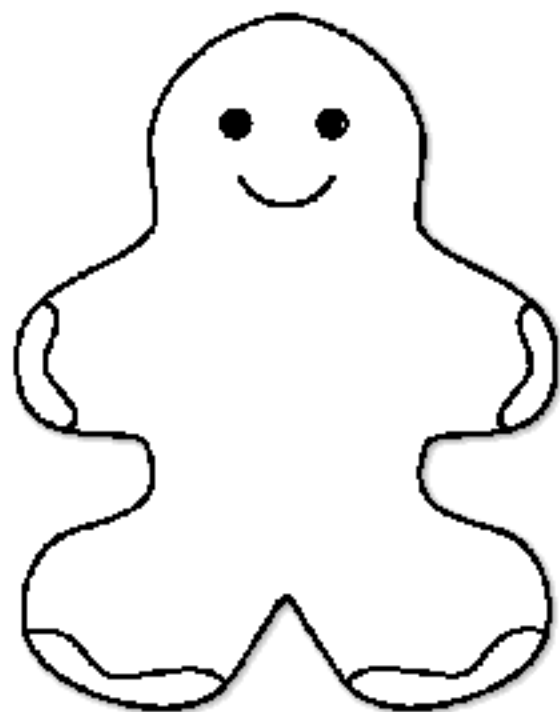


Christmas Song Book
