








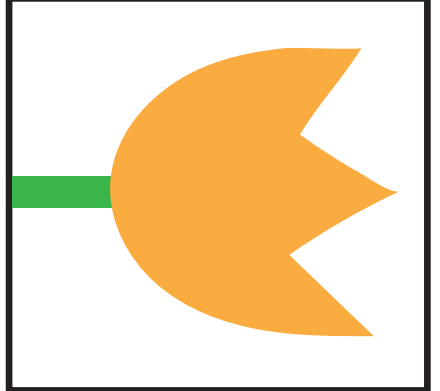
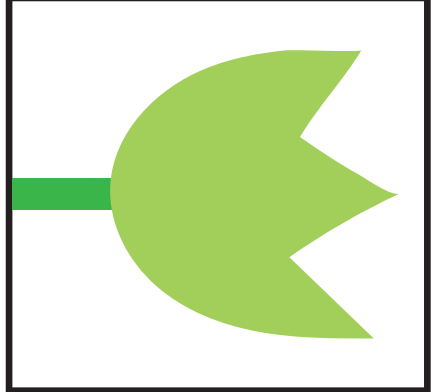
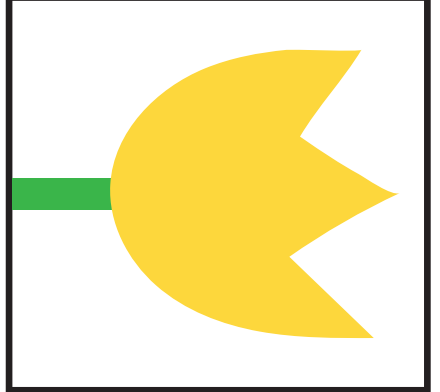
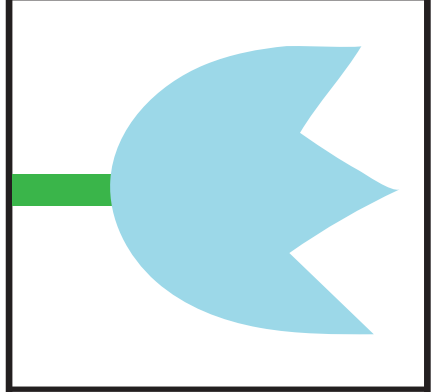
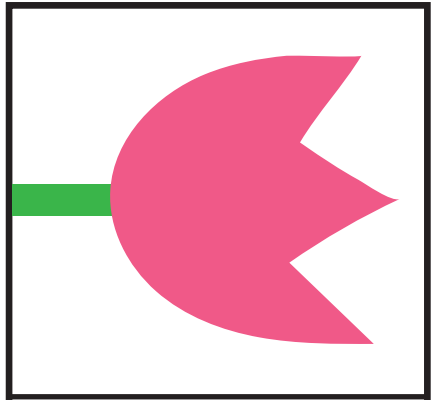
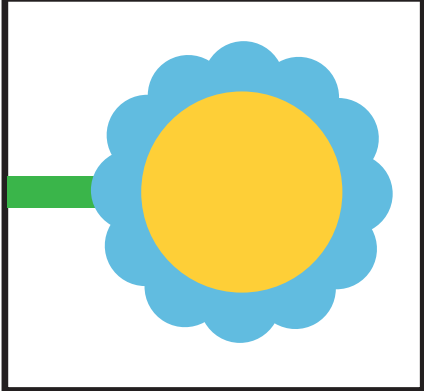
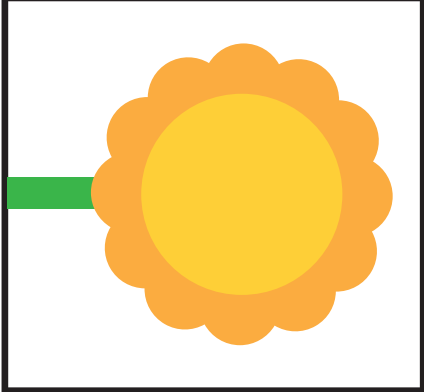
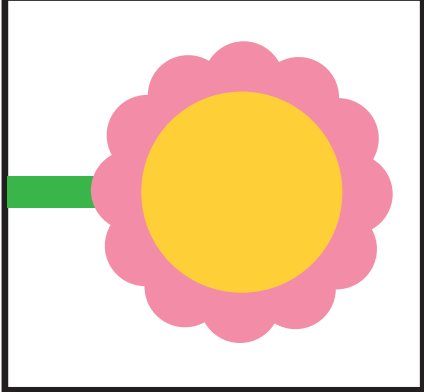
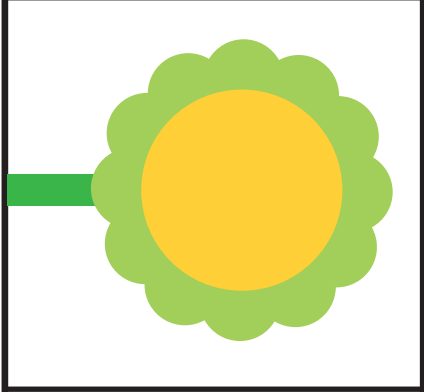
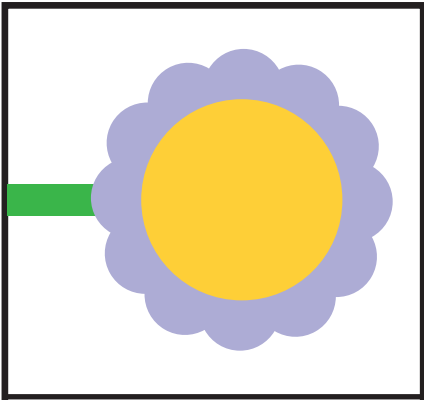
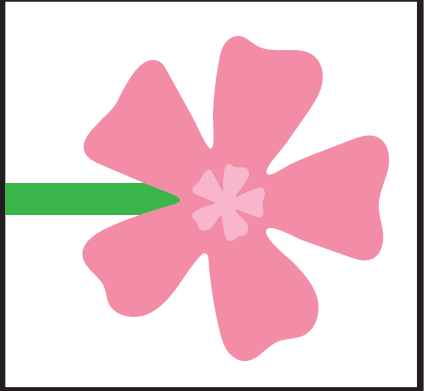
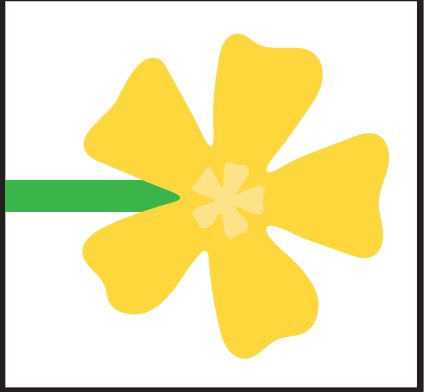
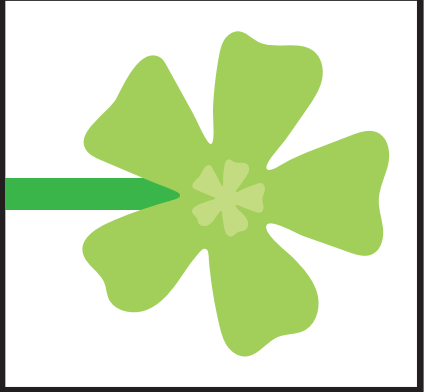
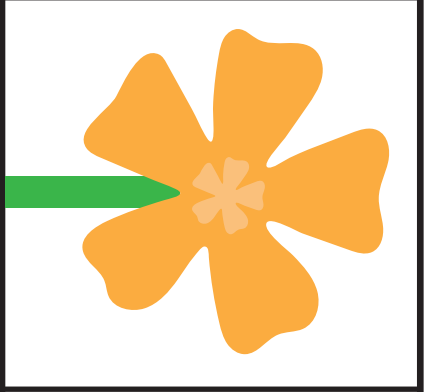
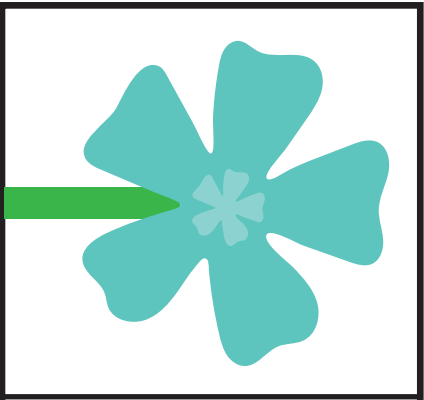


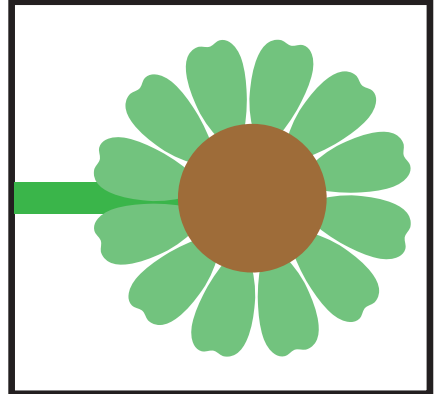
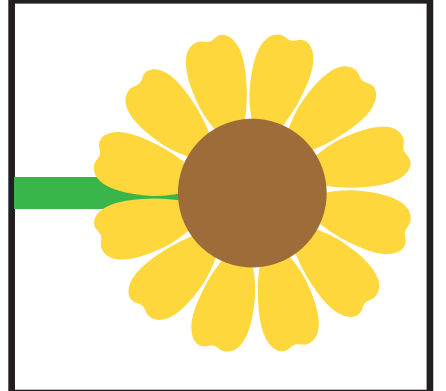
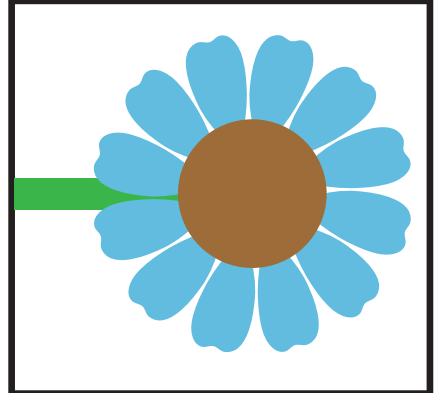
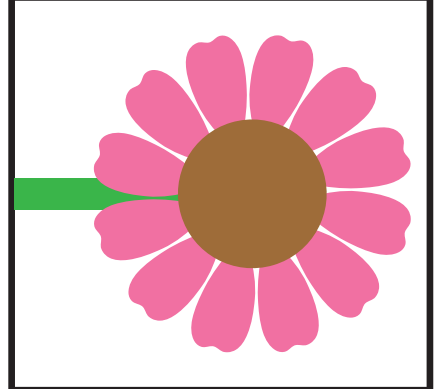
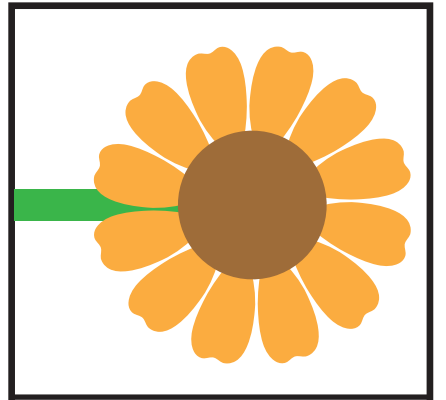
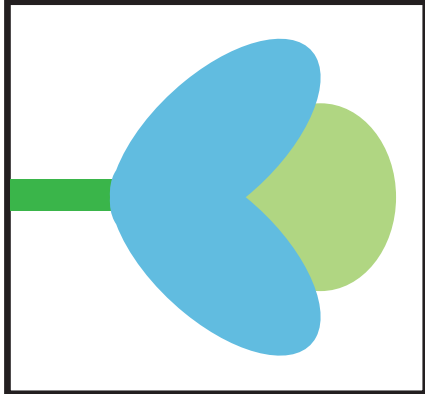
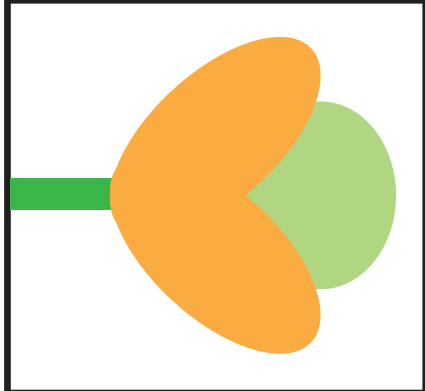
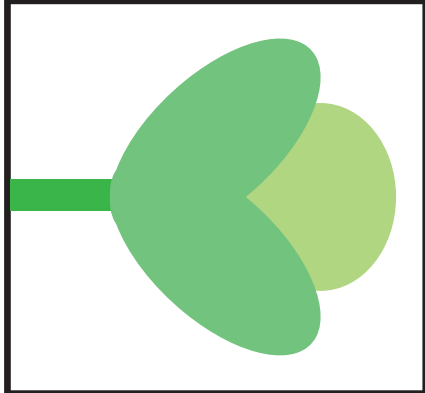
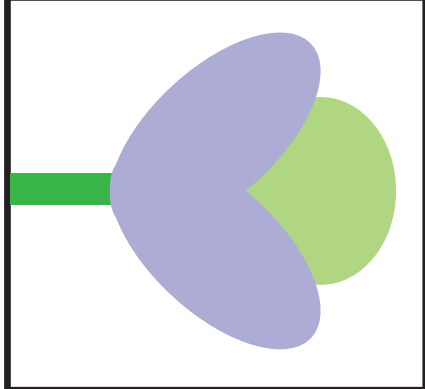
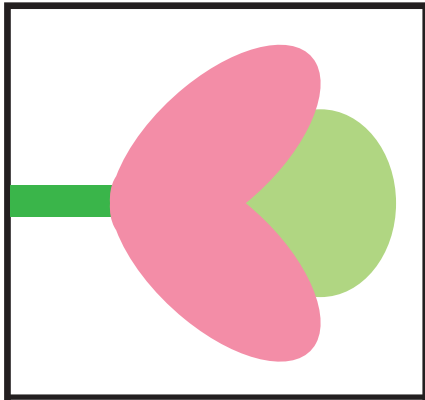
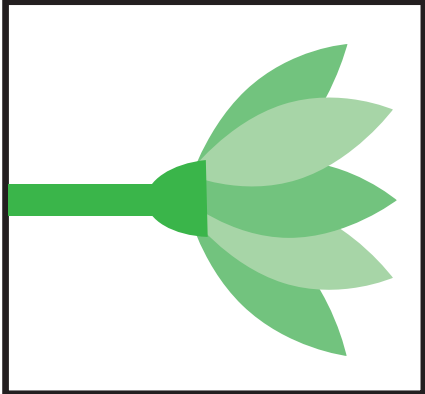
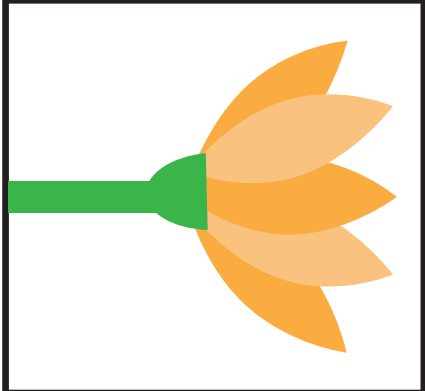
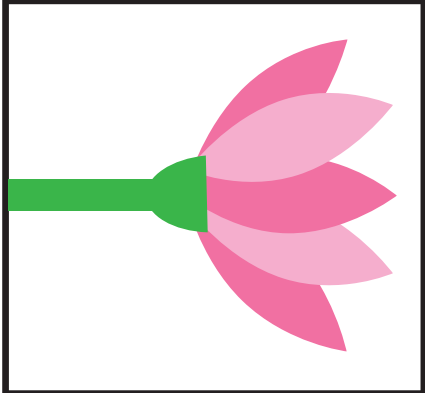
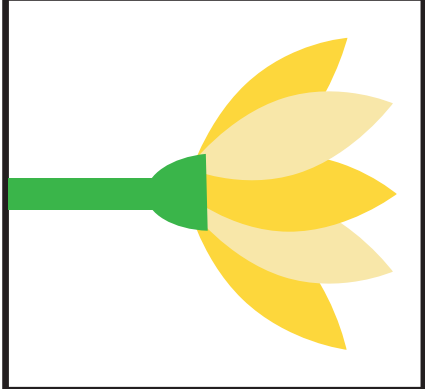
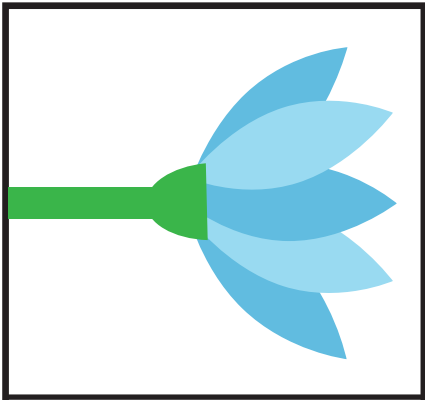


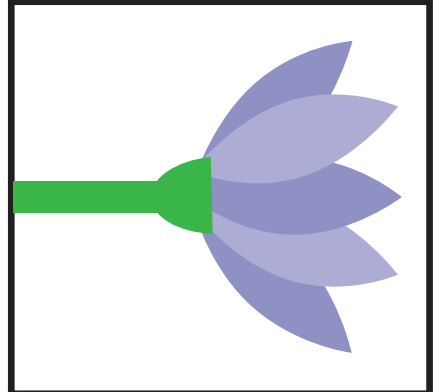
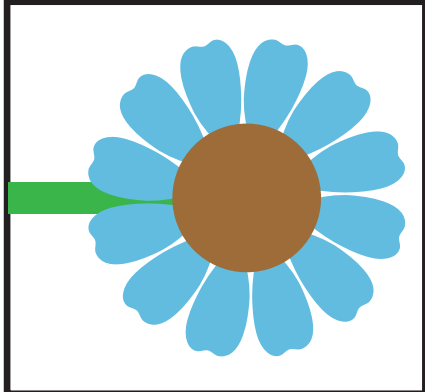
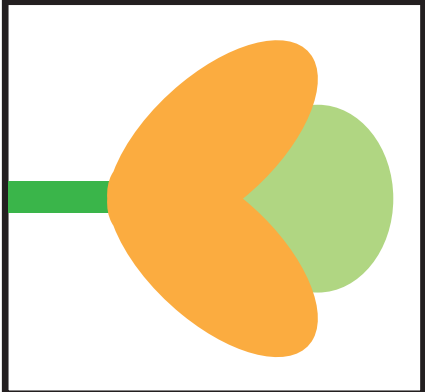
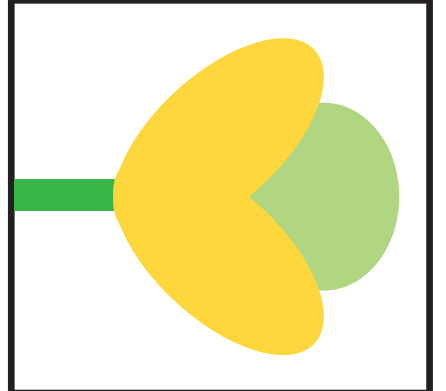
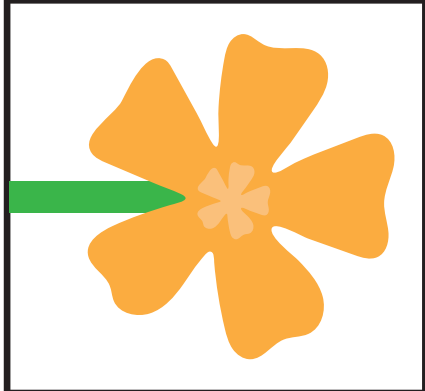
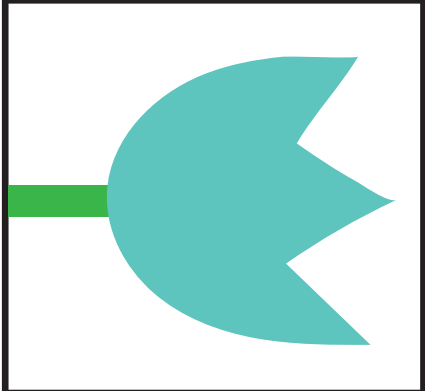
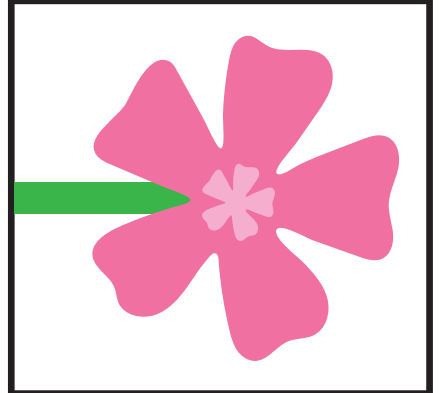
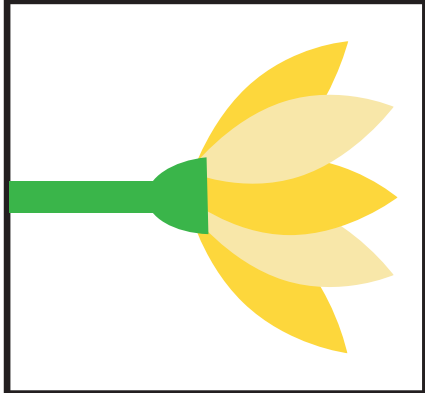
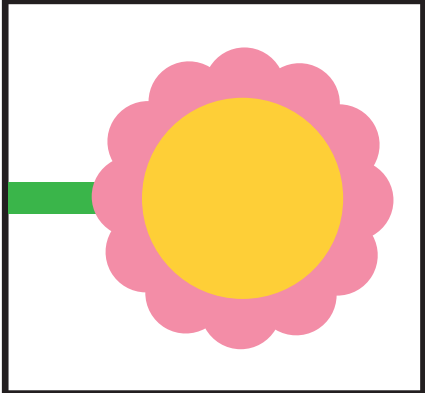
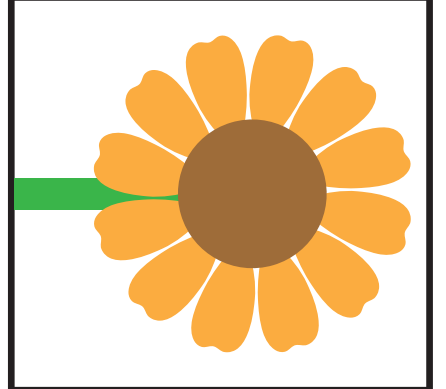
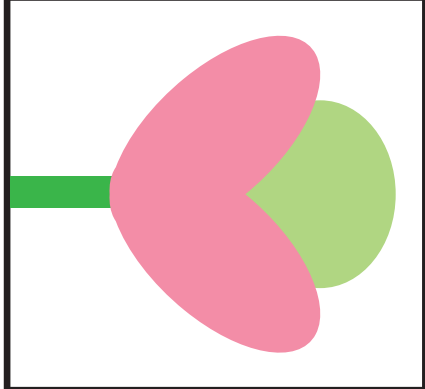
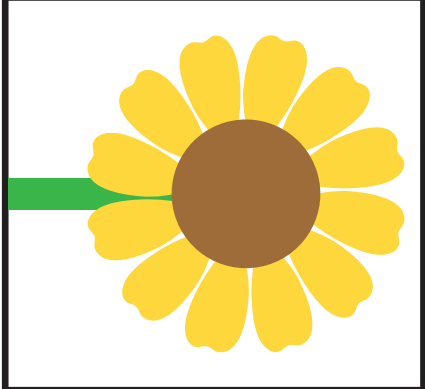
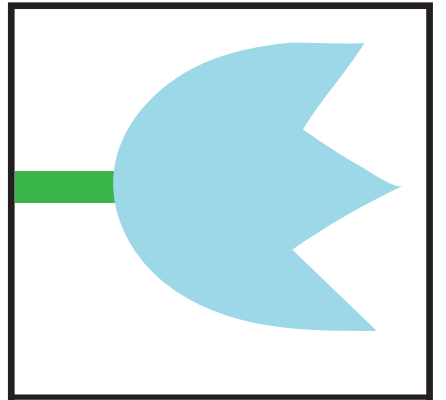
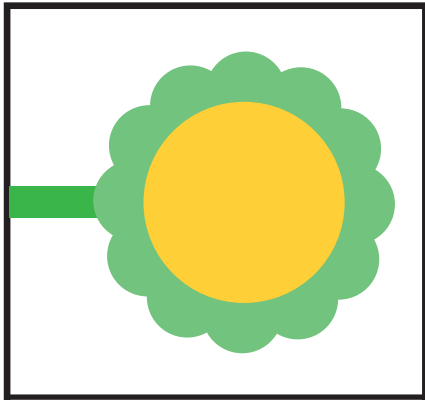
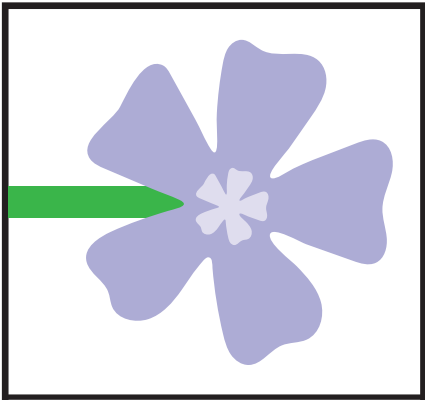












# Flower Cutting Strips
