



Drip Drop Raindrops

Print the raindrop patters ... cut out and glue onto a band of construction paper that has been measured to fit around child's head. Parents and teachers can wear them too.

This is a great way to work on body part identification skills. You can choose the body parts you want to put into the finger play

Drip drop ... drip drop ... a raindrop landed on my nose.

```
Drip drop ... drip drop ... I see raindrops.
```

Drip drop ... drip drop ... a raindrop landed on my hand.

Continue until you have named the body parts that you wanted to and end with:

Drip drop ... drip drop ... I see raindrops.
