# Shaun The Leprechaun

Instructions: Print leprechaun pattern on cardstock paper ... cut out and glue onto another sheet of cardstock paper and cut out (this makes the leprechaun thicker and more durable). Laminate and hot glue to a paint stirring stick. Punch a hole on one of the leprechaun shoulders and also in a clear sandwich page. Attach the sandwich bag to the leprechaun with a metal book ring.

Print letter ... number ... color coins on cardstock paper ... cut out and laminate. You can set them on a table ... attach velcro to the back and use on a feltboard or attach a magnet to the back and use on a magnetic board or cookie sheet.

There are a couple of different ways to do this activity. You can put either the letters ... numbers ... or color coins up and then say to the children "This is Shaun The Leprechaun and he is looking for letter coins to put in his bag. Can you help Shaun find the letter coins to put in his bag?"

You would then call on a child to come up and find a certain letter and the child would remove the coin from the feltboard ... magnetic board ... table and put it in the bag ... repeat all of the other children.

You can also give the children the coins while they are sitting down and then say "Who had the letter \_\_\_\_? Can you come up and put it in Shaun's bag?" You can also call specific children's names and say "Gabby ... can you come up and tell us what letter you have and put it in Shaun's bag?"
